<b>Title:</b>	Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health Strategy Outcome of Consultation		
<b>Executive Summary:</b>	<p>Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health: Everybody's Business is a joint commissioning strategy for Surrey and North East Hampshire sponsored by the Surrey Health and Wellbeing Board. This strategy was drafted following extensive co-design and stakeholder engagement across the area.</p> <p>A consultation, asking people if they agreed with the priorities and actions in the document, was launched on the 25<sup>th</sup> July with a final closing date of the 6<sup>th</sup> October 2014. The draft strategy was sent to a wide range of stakeholders including all those individuals and organisations involved in the co-design up to that point.</p> <p>116 responses were received of which 23 were collective responses from organisations, reflecting and representing a much wider range of views and opinions. So it is predicted that the number of individuals who have contributed to the consultation, albeit individually or as part of a collective response, is significantly higher.</p> <p>Following analysis of the consultation responses there is strong agreement and support of the over-arching aims and principles that the strategy identifies and the priorities and actions put forward. One topic area 'carers' required significant further dialogue which has taken place at a strategic and individual carer perspective level, resulting in a more clearly defined approach and acknowledgment of carers through the strategy.</p> <p>Areas that were identified as requiring either clarification or further input have been addressed and a number of new actions have been added to the final document.</p>
